# ICJ - Books about living with cancer

Last year, our Charity partnered with the Improving the Cancer Journey in Powys programme (a collaboration between <u>Macmillan</u>, <u>Powys County Council</u> and Powys Teaching Health Board) to deliver extra support for residents who have been diagnosed with cancer.

The project saw the purchase of quality assured books about cancer itself and the experience of living with cancer for our residents. The guidance in the books will provide support for those who are diagnosed with cancer, their carers, families and friends. These books are housed at 18 different libraries across Powys and are currently available on request.

A recently published article in the <u>Abergavenny Chronicle</u> highlighted the importance of these books and how they can be accessed.




