

Powys Health and Care Academy

Last year, PTHB Charity funded elements of the brand new Health and Care Academy in South Powys.

This project is set to enhance the available learning facilities in Powys, by providing an environment for students and staff to strengthen their skill set, grow the health and social care workforce and improve education within Powys. The training facility hopes to make Powys a 'sector of choice' for individuals seeking employment within Powys and encourage the working population of Powys to see healthcare as the first option when thinking about their career.



The Health Board and other funders provided the initial funding for the project, which included the renovation of the Basil Webb building and the adjacent bungalow. The complete redesign of both buildings would provide advanced learning facilities for health and social care education and also unlock the potential of the site for events, conferences and working collaboration.

The project team approached PTHB Charity for additional funding which went above and beyond the initial project brief to ensure that this would be a state-of-the-art facility in

Powys. The Charity provided technology and equipment to enable Powys to have better links with partners inside and outside of the county, increase the in-reach of the education and training and offer more research opportunities. The Charity also helped to supply modern furnishings for the learning hub to support improve the learning experience and create a learning environment which supports the ambitious aims of the project.

Basil Webb is now a hub for collaborative working with multiple spaces from working booths and meeting rooms to a conference area. The Magpies bungalow is now a training facility made to replicate a typical home environment for learners to gain a better understanding of the care required in the home.

The Health and Care Academy is now set for its official opening in October following a soft launch earlier in the year.

Additional funding for health and wellbeing projects


Don't miss out on our new resource for tracking health and wellbeing project funding opportunities available from other charities and third sector organisations.
