Situation – Provide a brief summary of the proposal and outline what it aims to address. (max 200 words)

In December 2020, the Health and Care Academy Blueprint was endorsed by PTHB's Board. The ambition is clear; activating the Health and Care Academy Model will support the health and care sector in Powys to become the sector of choice, by growing the workforce through local training and education, skills development and leadership. This will be delivered through a hub and spoke model.

Although the Health Board has a responsibility for the development of its people, the ambition is above and beyond what the Health Board would be expected to deliver as its core responsibility for education and development.

To set the foundations for the Academy, some initial ICF investment has been received to develop a pilot hub site at Bronllys. This initial investment and core funding will enable the facility to open, however, to enhance the offer, the programme team are seeking funding from the Charitable Funds Committee to the value of £180,000, to ensure the hub has a significant impact on the education, training and the learning experience. The Charitable Funds bid has been refocused on **phase 1** of the approach only.

It is anticipated that by adopting this model the Health Board will be addressing some of its wider social responsibility, by starting to make an impact on the economic climate of the county through a wider education, training and development opportunity.

The proposed Health and Care Academy model has been developed with partners across the sector through an Executive Steering Group, reportable to the Workforce Futures Programme Board, which acts as a key enabler of the 'Health & Care' strategy for Powys.

The concept of operating as a hub and spoke model across the county, offers a practical solution to the geographical footprint in Powys. It will offer modern, practical, academic and digital learning opportunities for staff, volunteers and carers. It will support local achievement of the aspirational health and care outcomes for the communities in Powys through in-service skills development, education and learning, and will have an important impact on the economy of Powys and Wales, by supporting improvements in employment opportunities.

We want to encourage the working population of Powys to see Health Care as the first option when thinking about their career. Adopting this approach is above and beyond what would be expected of the core business of the Health Board. With the right investment via Charitable Funds to provide digital learning directly to school aged children, we will widen career opportunities into Health Care.

There is a core requirement to deliver education, training and development across the health sector. The longer-term vision of the Academy offers us an opportunity to develop an **enhanced model**, **over and above** the core requirements, by enabling us to:

- Be an exemplar provider of rural professional and clinical education, by delivering an integrated in-service training offer that focuses on direct care, shared care and care delivered through digital;
- Be the sector of choice by growing the health and care workforce through skills development, education and local training, working with wider education providers and supporting the Welsh Language;
- Have a Leadership talent operating at all levels, compassionately working across systems, making a difference to the citizens and communities of Powys and empowering their teams to do so;
- Enable the workforce to respond to people's needs in a timely way, including our volunteers, paid and unpaid carers, through skills development and education opportunities.
- Be recognised as a centre of excellence for research, development and innovation within Wales, through trial and testing techniques; that includes a well-established industry relationship and supporting our core economy.

Work is underway to operationalise the Health and Care academy longer term which will ensure the model of working is sustainable into the future. However, the priority in **phase 1** is to capitalise on upfront ICF capital investment to begin the new model. This will enhance our current core education, training



and development provision, as such the Charitable Funds bid has been refocused on phase 1 of the approach only.

Assessment – Please provide a detailed assessment of the available evidence with a view to addressing the problem. (max 750 words)

The investment from Charitable Funds will focus on the **hub pilot site physical space**, which will further enhance an innovative learning environment. It will deliver a learning experience that far exceeds the current model. This will be achieved through the following components:

- Innovative learning environment that attracts learners into the sector and engages the current workforce in CPD by offering state of the art simulated learning and interactive learning;
- Learning environments that digitally link to each other through the hub and spoke model, this ensures there is an equitable access across a large geographical county and supports better links with a range of Academic partners outside of county which is currently not available;
- An increased in-reach of education, training and development into county that prevents staff from having to take unnecessary journeys and opens the education offer to a wider range of participants.

The benefits of an enhanced offer supported by Charitable Funds will enable the enhanced interior at Basil Webb to be realised at pace, specifically focused on enhancing the *interior of the physical space through latest technology and modern furnishings.*

Benefits of the Charitable Funds investment include supporting:

- the delivery of an environment that will support new ways of delivering Leadership development;
- the purchase of additional technology to provide an increased in-reach training, development and education offer across the sector;
- an enhanced environment that offers simulated/test and trial scenariobased learning space through the use of a modern training space;
- an environment where school children can attend (including virtual attendance) and learn about the sector and gain foundation skills which supports them to make informed career choices;
- a learning environment that enables access to an enhanced education, training and development for our carers and volunteers.



Recommendation – Detail your recommendation for the Charitable Funds Committee along with plans for evaluating the proposal and sustainability. (max 750 words)

An investment from Charitable Funds will take the academy from a training facility to being a flag ship building where our staff have access to education, through digital technology that is not currently available. This will enable the Health Board to utilise the facility for the development of carers and volunteers and more opportunities for school aged children to gain foundation skills, in a way that currently does not exist.

It will contribute to the requirements set out in the Future of Generations Act, which describes improving the economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being of Wales, by taking action through the lens of education and training.

Sustainability

In **Phase 1**, the programme will set the foundations of the Academy to include an Academy Hub building, offering a modern state-of-the-art learning environment. These foundations actively start to support improvements:

- across the quality and development of new models of care; ensuring the core business of the Academy is aligned to any transformational work underway across the health and care sector in Powys i.e. North Powys Wellbeing Programme
- in health and wellbeing; this specifically applies to the health and wellbeing of the workforce including volunteers and carers, by reducing the travel time the workforce has to travel to access some education, training and development outside of county. It also has an indirect impact on service users and patients who are being treated and cared for by a highly skilled, healthy, well workforce;
- in the efficiency of services; an enhanced education offer that supports the workforce to be more efficient and work at the top of their professional licence.

Further Academy development work will take place over the coming months to include activities such as:

- detailed 3-year plan for the Academy Model A high level sustainability vision has been articulated in the health and care academy blueprint aligned to the organisational business plan. NB a full detailed sustainability model will be included in the 3-year plan.
- The development of a recognisable 'brand' and offer from the Academy, to enable people inside and outside of Powys to understand what the Academy has to offer;
- Control A clear programme of work for each of the 'School' areas, including demonstrable progress in enhancing the current core offer;



 A well-established partnership approach to working with a wide range of provider organisations, supported by effective governance overseen by the Workforce Futures Programme Board;

Impact of Charitable Funds £180,000 investment

As this paper outlines, the initial upfront ICF investment and core funding alone will only be able to deliver a refreshed version of our core education, training and development. It will therefore not make the biggest impact on the learning environment/experience, neither will it make the significant impact we need on the economic climate of the county through a flagship hub site that could offer wider education, training and development opportunities.

However, with investment from Charitable Funds to enhance the pilot hub site, we will be able to deliver a **flagship hub site** with the ability to start to deliver over and above the current core education, training and development environment required by WG, the Denary, HEIW, Social Care Wales and professional groups, by supporting:

- the purchase of the latest digital technology enabling Powys to better link with partners inside and outside of county, increasing the in-reach of education and training into county and offer more research, innovation and improvement initiatives;
- the purchase of **modern furnishings** for the Hub that identifies the Academy's brand, supports an improved learning experience and creates environments that supports the health and wellbeing of the workforce;
- a significant impact on the communities in Powys through setting the foundations of a wide range of accessible state-of-the-art facilities and digital equipment currently unseen across Powys, which will provide upskilling solutions and wider access to education and career pathways into health and care.

The **risks** of Charitable Funds **NOT** investing include:

- An education environment that satisfies a core need, but is dated and delivers much of the same as before;
- Limited digital access to the environment for those who live a little further away, increasing travel and time spent getting to the hub;
- A continued limited access for carers and volunteers, who sometimes struggle to access skills updates and training;
- Limited ability to welcome school aged children into the health and care learning environment to gain foundation skills and knowledge.

Investment request to Charitable Funds

The programme team are seeking £180,000 of Charitable Funds to support phase 1 of the programme of work. As described in this paper the funding will enhance the pilot hub site, enabling us to deliver a flagship facility with the ability to start to showcase a range of delivery over and above the current core education, training and development environment.

Cost analysis

There will be no change from the current revenue cost for phase 1, and it is not anticipated that there are any additional staffing or other revenue costs associated with the development of the academy at this time.

Following NHS tender procedures, we will be ensuring any Charitable Funds purchases are cost effective, and therefore have sought indicative costs from a variety of providers on the NHS procurement framework. Detailed



indicative costs for digital technology, IT solutions and modern furnishings from a range of providers can be found in the appendices. A summary of this can be found in *table 1 – charitable funds investment spend*. These costs would be firmed up on the confirmation of approval of charitable funds.
