Dear Colleagues

With the summer holidays under way for many of us, I wanted to take the opportunity to update you on the progress on COVID-19 vaccination in Powys, and the next steps.

The key messages are:

- COVID-19 vaccination remains available for everyone aged 18 and over. Attend our drop-in sessions or use our Priority Access Form to get in touch.
- Invitations are being sent out to all 16-17 year olds in Powys. If anyone aged 16-17 in Powys does not receive their invitation by 20 August they will be able to use our Priority Access Form to let us know.
- Vaccination sessions are also under way for children aged 12-15 who are in the categories in the latest national guidance issued on 19 July. This includes children aged 12-15 with serious neurodisabilities, Downs Syndrome, immunocompromised, or profound/complex learning disabilities. It also includes children in this age group who are household contacts of people who are immunocompromised.
- Planning is well under way for the booster programme. Local arrangements will be finalised once we receive national guidance, which we currently expect by the middle of September.
- Over 90% of people aged 18+ in Powys have received their first dose, and nearly 87% of people aged 18+ in Powys have received their second dose.



Coronavirus continues to circulate. Coronavirus case rates in some parts of Powys are amongst the highest in Wales.

There is good evidence that two doses of the vaccine prevents serious illness from COVID-19, but we all need to assume that we can catch the virus and transmit it even if we have had the vaccine.

Hands, Face, Space, Fresh Air remain vital messages to protect ourselves and our loved ones. If you have symptoms, get a test. If you cannot work from home, then lateral flow device tests are available for people without symptoms.

Thank you for everything you are doing to Keep Powys Safe – and please do feel free to share this information in your organisations, networks and communities.



Drop-In Clinics Clinigau Galw Heibio

COVID-19 vaccination remains available for everyone aged 18 and over. You can attend our drop-in clinics. These are advertised through our social media channels and the latest information is also available from our website. Next week we have drop-in clinics confirmed on Saturday in Builth Wells and on Sunday in Bronlys and Newtown.

Already more than 80% of people aged 18-29 in Powys have taken up the first dose vaccination. This is the highest rate of all the health boards in Wales.

All of our first dose appointments are currently with the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine unless there is a clinical reason why you should not have this type of vaccine.

Our drop-in sessions are also open to anyone who will turn 18 by 31 October 2021.

16-17 years old 16-17 oed

Last week the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) published new guidance recommending that everyone aged 16-17 is offered their first dose.

We are already well under way with our offer to 16 & 17 year olds, and invitations are landing on doormats for appointments taking place next week.

If anyone in this age group does not receive an invitation by the end of next week, from 20 August our Priority Access Form will be open to everyone aged 16 and over:

Current guidance recommends one dose for most people aged 16 and 17*. We await further guidance on whether a second dose will also be offered.

*Some 16 and 17 year olds will be offered two doses. Based on current guidance this includes: those approaching their 18th birthday (people who will turn 18 by 31 October 2021); and, 16-17 year olds are in one of the high priority groups (for example, who are "clinically extremely vulnerable").



On 19 July, the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation published new guidance recommending vaccination for certain individuals aged 12 to 15.

This includes children aged 12-15 with serious neurodisabilities, Downs Syndrome, immunocompromised, or profound/complex learning disabilities. It also includes children in this age group who are household contacts of people who are immunocompromised.

Our Children's Nursing Teams, as well as specialists in Welsh Government, have been busy identifying those children who should be offered vaccination in this group. We are making contact with families to arrange vaccination, and some vaccinations have taken place this week.

Parents or guardians of children aged 12-15 who are household contacts of people who are immunosuppressed can also use the national referral form on the Welsh Government website to let us know:

We offer dedicated sessions for this age group, recognising that they may have additional support needs. This means that we are not currently able to offer drop-in sessions for children aged 12-15. All children aged 12-15 should be accompanied to their vaccination by an adult.

Booster Vaccine Brechlyn Atgyfnerthu

On 30 June, the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation published interim guidance for a potential COVID-19 booster vaccine programme this winter.

This is interim guidance only, so it is subject to change. It currently recommends a booster vaccine for some parts of the adult population but not all.

We expect further guidance by the middle of September, and will make sure we share further information when we receive it. This includes a dedicated web page about the booster programme:

In most cases, your invitation for a booster will come from the health board. We kindly ask that you do not contact your GP practice or the health board about a booster programme in the meantime. Please do look out for further details next month, and thank you for your patience.

Welsh Government has put in place arrangements for an NHS COVID Pass. The NHS COVID Pass allows you to show others, when travelling abroad, that you've had a COVID-19 vaccine.
