Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information, which was received on 18 November 2024, to confirm, in accordance with S.1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) does hold the information that you require. For ease of reference your request is set out below and my response follows.

Your Freedom of Information (FOI) Request:

I am writing to request access to records under the Freedom of Information Act (2000). Specifically, we are seeking the following information for a full year 2018-2019:

Q1. What is the most common missed fracture in your health board for which compensation claims have been made?

Q2. For that year, please provide a breakdown of:

- The type of fracture that was missed (e.g. Scaphoid, Hip etc....)
- The number of compensation claims made regarding missed fractures
- The amount of compensation paid for each case

Powys Response:

Q1. I can confirm Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) has not had any missed fractures for which compensation claims have been made, during the timeframe requested.

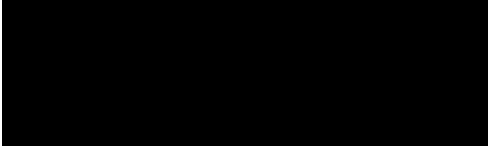
Q2. Not applicable.
