## Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information, which was received on 25 November 2024, to confirm, in accordance with S.1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) partly holds the information that you require. For ease of reference your request is set out below and my response follows.

- Treatment exceeding the above timeframe requires referral to the Tissue Viability.
- Procedures otherwise associated with minor injuries are excluded.

Q4. I can confirm the claim amount is £20.41.

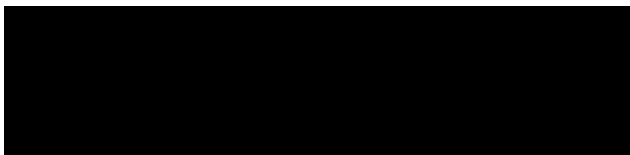
Q5. The Additional Clinical Services Local Supplementary Service does not refer to either simple or complex wound care. All post-operative wound care is included in the specification.
