Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information, which was received on 07 October 2025, to confirm, in accordance with S.1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) partially holds the information that you require. For ease of reference your request is set out below and my response follows.

Your Freedom of Information (FOI) Request:

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act to request the following information:

I request that you disclose:

Q1. Presentation slides, speaker notes, handouts and other documents used as part of any training you give on the Prevent counter-extremism strategy; and -

Q2. The dates on which these trainings were most recently updated.

For the avoidance of doubt, this request encompasses both (1) training that you give to your staff, and (2) training that you give to individual trusts and hospitals, for example. If this training has been created by a third-party organisation, please disclose the name of that organisation.

Powys Response:

Q1. I can confirm that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) staff can access Prevent training via two online platforms. Prevent Level 1 is accessed via the National Electronic Staff Record (ESR). The package is an NHS England training package. Prevent Level 3 is accessed via the Home Office training platform.

Q2. We are unable to answer question 2 as the training packs are not managed by PTHB.

As outlined in our communication dated 7 October 2025, if you are in contact with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) regarding a breach under the FOI Act, we would be grateful if you could update them on Powys Teaching Health Board's (PTHB) position as follows:

From our perspective, we do not believe that PTHB has breached its obligations under the Act, as the original request does not appear to have been received into our organisation. If the email address used to submit the request is the same as the one referenced in shared correspondence with the ICO, this may explain the issue as it is incorrect.

Should the Information Commissioner Office, contact us directly, we will also provide an update on this position.

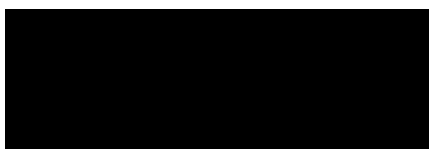
Re-use of Public Sector Information
