Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information which was received on 27 October 2025 following issue of our Internal Review response to FOI.488.25, to confirm, in accordance with S.1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) does hold the information that you require. For ease of reference your request is set out below and the Health Board's response follows.

Your Freedom of Information (FOI) Request:

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act to request the following information:

Original question: The monthly number of adults receiving an official ADHD diagnosis from January 2022 to December 2024.

New question: Thank you for responding to my query and clarifying the limits which you are prepared to retrieve data on the numbers of adults diagnosed with ADHD. I am aware that the results may be skewed, but I would be happy to have five months of data from July 2024 to November 2024.

Powys Response:

Please see the table below for the number of adults diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) from July 2024 to November 2024.

Please note: Through acquiring these figures, it became evident that there were a number of Did Not Attend (DNA's) or cancellations by clients and due to scheduling in advance a number of these clients were then assessed and diagnosed out of the timeframe we are capturing data for. There were also a handful of clients that were not diagnosed with ADHD, with the majority of these being transferred over to the Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC) assessment and diagnosis pathway.

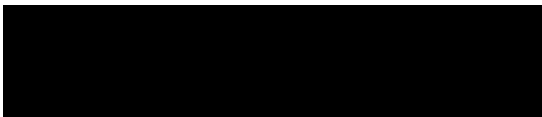
Re-use of Public Sector Information
