Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information which was received on 17 April 2026, to confirm, in accordance with S.1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) does hold the information that you require. For ease of reference your request is set out below and the Health Board's response follows each question individually.

Your Freedom of Information (FOI) Request and Powys Response (Bold):

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act to request the following information:

Q1. How many learning disability, child and adolescent mental health services are there within your health board? – **I can confirm that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) has Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAHMS) divided into North and South Powys consisting of:**

- **Specialist Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (SCAHMS)**
- **Primary Mental Health Support Service (PMH)**
- **Crisis**
- **Single Point of Access**
- **Therapy**
- **Psychiatry**
- **Schools In-Reach**
- **Learning Disability**

Q2. Where are these teams located and could we please have contact details.
