Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000

I write further to your request for information which was received on 18 May 2026, to confirm, in accordance with S.1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) does not hold the information that you require. For ease of reference your request is set out below and the Health Board's response follows each question individually.

Your Freedom of Information (FOI) Request and Powys Response (Bold):

I have a freedom of information request related to the diagnosis and treatment of Spinal Muscular Atrophy. Your answers to the following questions would be greatly appreciated.

Q1. How many patients have a current diagnosis for Spinal Muscular Atrophy (ICD-10 Code G12.0, G12.1, G12.8 and G12.9) at your trust?

Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) does not hold comprehensive information on patient diagnoses, as this is primarily held within primary care. PTHB are able to provide information on patients admitted to Powys hospitals where Spinal Muscular Atrophy (using codes supplied: G12.0, G12.1, G12.8 and G12.9) has been recorded as a diagnosis during that admission.

Please note that this will not represent the total number of individuals living with, or diagnosed with the condition, as many patients are diagnosed and managed in primary care or outpatient settings and may not require hospital admission. Please let us know if you require this information.

Q2. How many patients have been treated in the last 4 months (January to April 2026) with the following products:

- Spinraza (Nusinersen)
- Zolgensma (Onasemnogene)

Q2. I can confirm that Powys Teaching Health Board (PTHB) does not initiate treatment with any of the medicines listed; patients are treated by providers outside of Powys. PTHB commission services from a number of Welsh health boards and English provider organisations. However in paediatrics, these medications are specialist commissioned by NHS Wales Joint Commissioning Committee (NWJCC) who you may wish to contact via: nwjcc@wales.nhs.uk

Due to the complex nature of PTHB's commissioning arrangements, not all of our providers indicate the indication for use for each episode of care where these drugs are used. For this reason, PTHB does not hold the data relating to your request, however, the health board is working closely with providers to ensure that this information can be provided in the future. We therefore recommend that you approach our providers for this information directly:

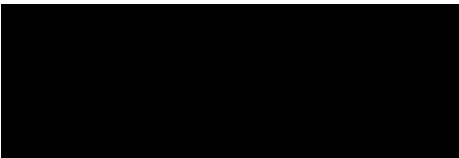
Re-use of Public Sector Information
